Stop and Smell the Roses

The most frequently asked question about roses is "What rose/roses do you recommend?"

Personally I encourage people to grow shrub roses because they are hardier, require less maintenance and are more disease resistant than the commonly preferred Hybrid Tea and Floribunda roses.

Some of the most winter-hardy roses available are those bred and grown in Canada. These are the Explorer Series (developed in Ottawa) and the Parkland Series (developed in Morden, Manitoba)

Explorer Series:

David Thompson shrub medium red, repeat bloom slight fragrance **George Vancouver** shrub medium red repeat bloom slight fragrance **Henry Kelsey** shrub/climber medium red, repeat bloom fragrant **Jens Munk** shrub medium pink repeat bloom slight fragrance

Parkland Series:

Adelaide Hoodless shrub red, prune spent flower for repeat bloom slight fragrance Hope for Humanity shrub deep red, repeat bloom slight fragrance Prairie Joy shrub medium pink, repeat bloom slight fragrance Winnipeg Parks shrub medium red, repeat bloom slight fragrance

Other Shrub Roses:

Abraham Darby apricot yellow repeat bloom fragrant **Bonica** light pink repeat bloom slight fragrance Graham Thomas deep yellow repeat bloom fragrant **Mary Rose** medium pink repeat bloom fragrant

Climbers:

Dortmund red repeat bloom slight fragrance **Dublin Bay** red repeat bloom fragrant **New Dawn** pink repeat bloom fragrant

Hybrid Tea:

Elina yellow repeat bloom slight fragrance
Garden Party cream with pink edges repeat bloom fragrant
Mister Lincoln dark red repeat bloom fragrant
Peace soft yellow pink edges repeat bloom slight fragrance

Floribunda:

Betty Boop red with white centre repeat bloom
Fairy Tale pink with cream edges repeat bloom slight fragrance
Hot Cocoa chocolate burnt orange repeat bloom fragrant
Sexy Rexy medium pink repeat bloom slight fragrance

Grandiflora:

Queen Elizabeth pearly pink repeat bloom slight fragrance
